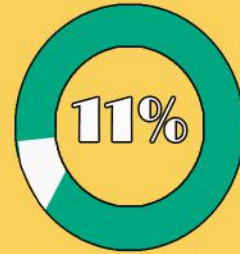


Budget Breakdown

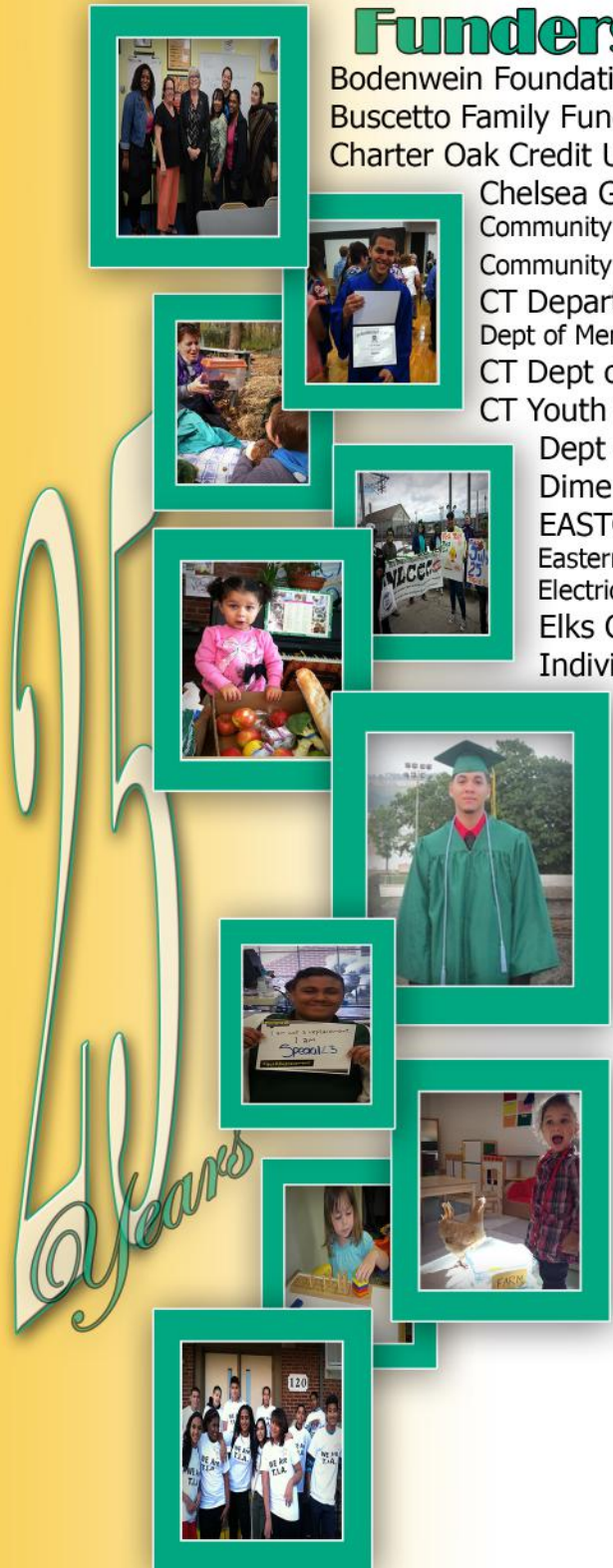

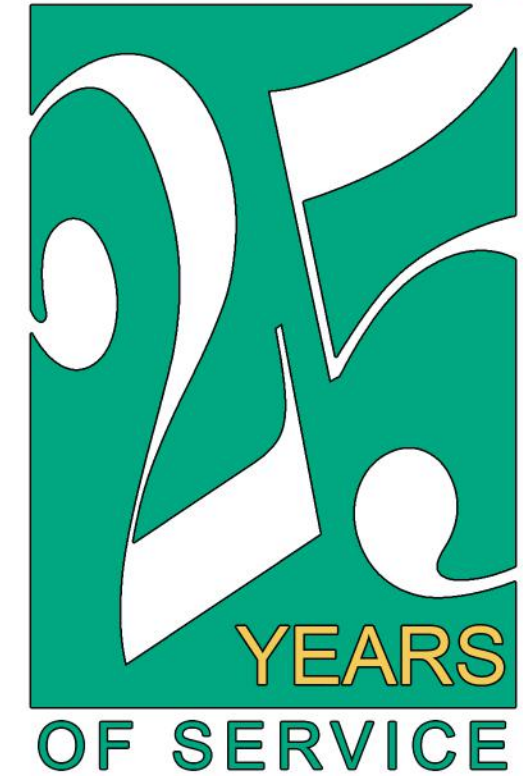

High school achievement is linked to post secondary education and adulthood socioeconomic success, which is a close predictor of health and well being.

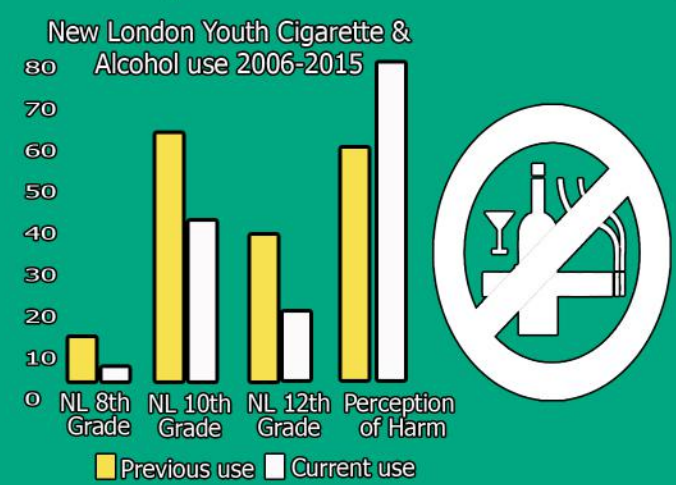
Parent Leadership Training
